

YOUTH IN-COUNTRY CONSULTATION: PHILIPPINES for ASPBAE 8th General Assembly



BACKGROUND

ASPBAE will convene its 8th General Assembly (GA) in 2020. Organised as a set of virtual and face-to-face, country and regional-level processes through the year, the GA offers a space and platform to assess and plan ASPBAE's strategic responses, defining the directions of its future work.

ASPBAE believes that voices of marginalized youth must be integrated in the discussions of its strategic planning and shaping future youth work. Therefore, ASPBAE will conduct regional youth consultation to listen to youth perspectives and to generate ideas for youth and education. The regional youth consultation will be held in November, 2020. In line with this, in-country youth consultations will be held to capture diverse voices and experiences.

In line with this and as a preparatory action, an in-country youth consultation will be held first to seek a more diverse voices and experiences in a wider range. All activities will be done online. The objectives of the consultation are the following:

- Create safe spaces for young people who want to articulate issues, concerns, questions, and challenges of youth in their own place and in the neighbourhood;
- Gather and discuss situations of young people specifically in terms of education and life-long learning;
- Deliberate on lived realities of young people, specifically in terms of their education and life-long learning;
- Seek feedback on ASPBAE's on-going youth work and generate ideas for new ways of working with young people from marginalized communities;
- Reflect on ASPBAE's youth work and generate ideas on how to improve its strategies and suggest new and better paths of engagement.



E-Net Philippines as a member of ASPBAE conducted its in-country consultation this October 2020 convening three groups of youth - theYAR, the non-YAR, and a youth-student organisation called PUP SPEAK together with Central Student Council and Office of Student Regent of the Polytechnic University of Philippines - to seek a wider range of youth situation, issues and recommendations particularly on the aspect of education.



THE PARTICIPANTS

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The YAR group is composed of 15 young people who are also Youth Action Researchers of ASPBAE and E-Net.

They are from Safe Cities Youth Theatre Advocacy Group (SCYTAG) in Barangay Commonwealth, Quezon City and Youth for Nationalism and Democracy (YND) in Barangays Bagbag and Holy Spirit.



Non-YAR Group



The Non-YAR group is composed of 5 students from Division of Kidapawan City in Mindanao together with their Youth Adviser, 2 students from LVC Palawan, 1 student from Judge Belmonte High School in Quezon City and 1 Youth Council Chairman from Project 6 Quezon City.

FEEDBACK ON THE YOUTH ACTION RESEARCH

Continue Youth Action Research yearly because the reasons why OSYs are increasing changes every year. The OSY is higher now during the pandemic compared to 2015 when YAR started. We must dig deeper and find out why the population of OSY has increased. Usually, when we talk about youth, we pertain to students. It's a big thing that we are recognizing the OSY sector and ask them why they are not able to study. When we are able to know and understand their situation, we can formulate solutions like dialogue with the local government and seminar for those young people.

This is important especially in the community because there are increasing suicidal and depression cases. More and more youth in the community are committing suicide and this has been increasing now in the pandemic. There are also increasing number of teenage pregnancy which is one of the reason why they are dropping out.

There are young people who wants to study but their family can't support them. Even if the tuition is free, there are still additional expenses that they need to spend for the school supplies, allowances, and school projects. At the same there are no gadgets for the families. There are young people who dropped out because their parents loss their jobs during the pandemic. Their money is not enough to buy food what more in buying load and devices for their classes? The Local Government gave only one tablet per family and this is not enough because most families has more than two children, and there is no signal and load in the communities. Even if they want to study have a better future with education, this is not provided by the government.



These are the realities that the youth faced that were emphasized through the Youth Action Research.

YND is geared towards conducting psychosocial debriefing with the youth due to the stress that the pandemic and online classes are bringing. They should have conducted it this October but due to many issues, they have postponed it this November. In other communities, YND is trying to establish a community learning hub in partnership with the barangay. This is for those students who are not getting enough attention and assistance from their families because their parents has to work or has not enough knowledge to help them to study. SCYTAG will be conducting sexuality education in the community to address the increasing number of teenage pregnancy.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE CONTINUITY OF YAR

Continue conducting relief operations to the youth while doing the research. This effort should be strengthened and emphasized as part of the work of YAR. By doing that, we are able to show that even if we are victims of the pandemic, young people can still mobilize and help in the communities.

The research during the pandemic is limited because there is no face-to-face contact. There should be a change and revisualization of the methodology of the research. We should maximize the technology available and change the mode maybe through zoom. They can gather more young people as long as the budget is secured. Moreover, add in the survey the question in further deepening the reason why OSY are not able to study.

Engage the Local Government to conduct dialogues to address the issues of the OSYs such as stress, depression, online classes, and hopefully provide scholarships for them so they can continue education.

TheResearcher pointed out that they were not able to interview other youth because they are asking question on what will happen after the research. Think about concrete plans that we can do for young people that is a part of the YAR like the following:

- Relief Operation-
- Giving of digital training on online safety;
- Psychosocial debriefing for youth due to stress;
- What's in it for them? What happens next?


FRANCIS AUSTIN BIONG


NEILVIN AVENTURADO


JOHN FERSON APOLINARIO




ELAICE NEIL SOLEDA


ZAIRA ASAKIL

OWEN ASCUNSION





Young people are overwhelmed by misleading information thru social media and different publication. Historical Distortion is also rampant that made the youth fed by wrong views of our society.
